The last day of Term will see our students spend the morning with their Tutor. There will be some fun tutor activities and each year group will have a virtual Term Awards that will

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


Special Note for Third Year Students from Anna

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December 2020 UPDATE FROM PGTA and BOM - #buildclonturk campaign

Dear Parent,

We are getting in touch to update you on the progress of the campaign to provide the students and staff of Clonturk Community College with the modern, purpose-built school they need and deserve. You will find more detail on the campaign in the PowerPoint presentation which was presented at the recent AGM and is now on the school website.

While we continue to work with City of Dublin Education and Training Board to ensure the necessary facilities are in place to meet the requirements of the school intake of September 2021, our primary objective remains to secure agreement, funding and delivery for a purpose-built new school on the site.

Since the election of a new government this summer, our focus has been on Minister for Education Norma Foley and her party. We have been in correspondence with all relevant Fianna Fáil representatives in the area, and parliamentary questions have been submitted to the Minister in the Dáil and Seanad on the Department of Education's plans for Clonturk. We regret to report that the Department's official response has been disappointing, although the Minister has agreed to meet a delegation from the Board of Management in January.

All indications are that the time has come for a much broader, more high-profile and high-pressure campaign to #BuildClonturk. This campaign will need to draw on the commitment, enthusiasm, skills and contacts of our large and rapidly growing school community. We look forward to hearing your views, consulting on next steps and agreeing a plan of action early in the New Year.
